

Upland Game Birds (CD Version)

Welcome to an exciting adventure into the world of eBooks. At first, it may seem rather clumsy reading this book from your computer screen. If you like, you can print out each of these "Parts" and have the entire book in print.

You must have Acrobat Reader version 8.0 or later to get the most out of this book. Click on the tab called "cover sheet" in the heading in the upper left to see instructions on how you can get an updated version of the Acrobat Reader.

NAVIGATING THE DOCUMENT

After you open the PDF document you will see a panel along the left side of the page. This will give you the major divisions of the book which are in separate files. Click on anyone of them to jump to the selected section. To close this panel click on the Icon above the panel to toggle between opening it and closing it. It is the third in the group of Three Icons. Try them all to see what they do.

Each of the "Parts" have at the beginning a Table of Contents. You can jump to any of the subject headings by clicking on it. Be sure you click on the Hand Tool (upper middle) first and then you will see the full hand turn into a hand with a pointing finger over the link on the section.

To navigate to a particular page number look at the top center and you will see the Page Navigation Toolbar. The two arrows signify going to the "Previous" page or the "Next" page. The counter gives the current page and the total pages in the document. Highlight the current page number and type in a page, hit inter, that you want to go to and hit Enter. You will go to that page.

You can play with the Zoom Toolbar to get the magnification of the page that you like. Try each of these and see what suites you.

SEARCHING FOR WORDS OR PHRASES

1. Type in a word or phrase in the "find" box. You can then chose various search methods.

2. Enter a keyword or phrase you want to find. You can chose to search the current file or the whole book. You can find some suggested search words in the Appendixes of this book. These are just some words and topics to start your mind thinking about what you are really interested in. You can go directly to these words and phrases. This is fun to play with, so enjoy!

USING PAGE THUMBNAILS

With the panel closed you will see the "Thumbnails" Icon in the upper left outside the page. Click on this and you will get a single line of Thumbnails along the left side of the page. You can get these in double, triple or more by dragging the border of the panel to the right.

It is an easy matter to jump to any of the pages just by clicking on the Thumbnail. This is a good way to see what is available in the document. To see the entire page click the little "x".

MORE HELP

You can get more help from Adobe by clicking on the Green Question mark in the pane at the left.

Part One through Part Seven, deals with the raising of quail, partridge, pheasants, junglefowl, wild turkeys and guineafowl, with excellent information on feeding, managing breeding, hatching eggs, and raising chicks to maturity.

Part Eight, is a very handy section on disease. It includes treatment of the most common ailments that affect upland game birds. It can be used as a handy reference in the diagnosis and treatment of sick game birds.

This is a "*how to*" book on raising game birds if there ever was one. It is documented from the extensive research that went into its preparation which gives creditable information for the reader. It contains a complete alphabetized index that gives the reader easy reference.
